Dr. Kolanowski's research focuses on complex care issues in the health of the elderly, dementia behavior in the elderly and non-pharmacological interventions for behavioral symptoms in persons with dementia. She has done extensive work in the area of tailoring or individualizing patient interventions. She recently received funding from NINR for a five year project titled "A Prescription to Enhance Resident Quality of Life." The primary aim of the study is to test the efficacy of recreational activities derived from the NDB model in reducing agitation and passivity and improving engagement, affect and mood in nursing home residents with dementia.
